During the semester we will have four mid-term exams and a final. The lowest of the four mid-term exams will be dropped; the student's grade will be based solely on the remaining three midterm exams and the final, each of which will be worth 25% of the total grade. For the midterm exams, approximately 65% of the points will come from multiple choice questions with the final 35% of the exam based upon free-response problems; the final exam will consist solely of multiple choice questions. The midterm exams are evening assembly exams and are scheduled for Tuesday, September 21st; Thursday, October 14th; Tuesday, November 9th; and Monday, December 6th. The final exam date is set by the University and the exam must be taken at the assigned time.

A student's final grade is based upon a standard grading scale:

A : 90 % or above
B⁺: 87 % or above
B : 80 % or above
C⁺: 77 % or above
C : 70 % or above
D⁺: 67 % or above
D : 60 % or above
E : below 60 %

No additional points will be given at the end of the semester to boost a

student's grade. **Please do not** inform me that you need to make a "C" in my class to remain in the Business School, to be accepted into medical school, to remain at UF, etc.; I am not responsible for the grades you have received in other classes and it is not my responsibility to tailor **my class** so that you can receive a passing grade.

Attendance is mandatory if a student wishes to master the subject and the student is responsible for all announcements made in class as well as all material covered in class. Makeup tests will only be given in cases of documented illness or for students participating in official University events. The exams will be assembly exams to be held during the evening; the midterm exam dates are: Tuesday 9/21; Thursday 10/14; Tuesday 11/9; and Monday 12/06. It is the responsibility of the student to be present during examinations. Homework will be assigned on a daily basis and it is imperative for students to complete all assignments in order to perform well on the exams. In general only odd-numbered homework problems will be assigned so that students can check their work with the answers in the back of the book or with a solution's manual. Academic dishonesty in any form will not be tolerated and will be treated in accordance with the policies of the University of Florida. During the course of the semester we will cover material from chapters 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.
